This unique program is designed to create meaningful connections between youth and seniors while fostering the exchange of valuable skills and knowledge.

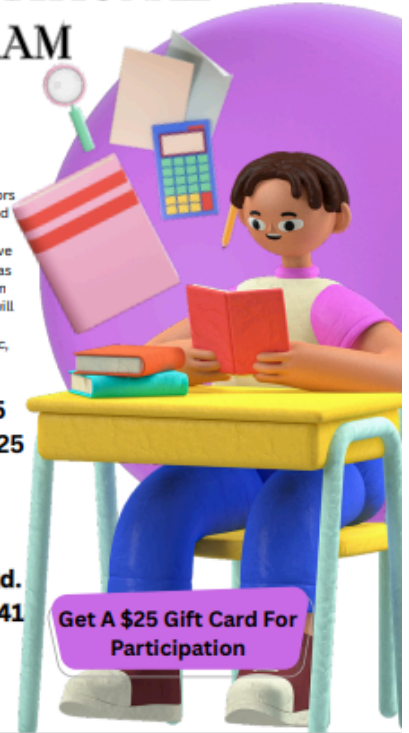

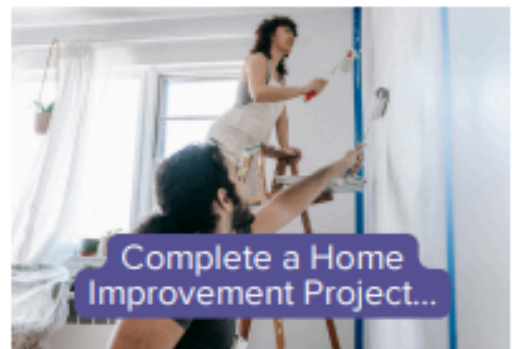
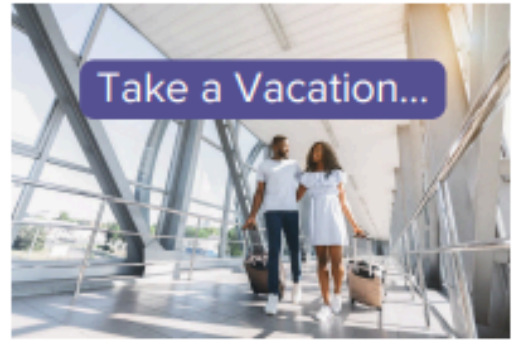
