Light the Night in Inkster

As the days grow shorter and the evenings arrive earlier, the Inkster Police Department is launching a simple but powerful safety reminder — “Light the Night in Inkster.”

A well-lit home isn’t just inviting; it’s one of the easiest ways to deter crime and help first responders locate you quickly in an emergency. Proper outdoor lighting improves visibility, increases safety for pedestrians and drivers, and shows that our community is active and alert — even after dark.

Here’s how you can do your part to keep Inkster bright and safe this season:

- **Keep it lit:** Turn on porch, garage, and yard lights from dusk until dawn.
- **Use motion-sensor lights:** They save energy and instantly alert you to movement around your property.
- **Check your address visibility:** Make sure house numbers are clearly visible from the street, day or night. Reflective or illuminated numbers help first responders find you faster.
- **Trim bushes and trees:** Clear away branches that block lights or obscure entryways.
- **Be a good neighbor:** Encourage friends, family, and neighbors to join in — a brighter block is a safer block.

Together, we can create a community that’s well-lit, welcoming, and watchful. Let’s Light the Night in Inkster!

LIGHT THE NIGHT HOME SAFETY CHECKLIST

(CUT OUT OR POST ON YOUR FRIDGE AS A REMINDER)

- Porch light working and turned on nightly**
- Motion-sensor lights installed near entryways or driveways**
- Yard and side lights checked and bulbs replaced**
- House numbers clearly visible from the street (reflective or lit)**
- Shrubs and trees trimmed to keep walkways and lights clear**
- Spare light bulbs on hand for quick replacements**
- Neighbors reminded to join the “Light the Night” effort**
- Report any broken streetlights to the City of Inkster Public Works Department**

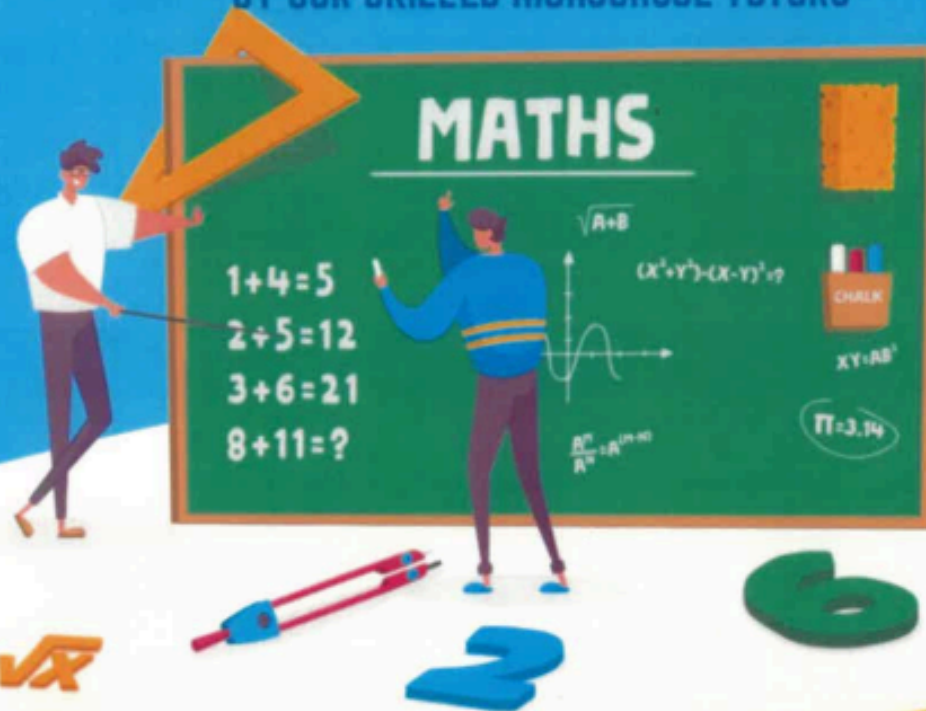
